

### AEDC School Profile\*



### What it will tell you

The School Profile provides in-depth information about the cohort of children captured in the AEDC data at your school, including:

- · child demographic characteristics
- · transition to school information
- your school's AEDC domain and summary indicator results over time, including the latest collection year
- information about how to use your school's results
- links to other AEDC resources.

Schools are encouraged to view their *School Profile* alongside community, state/territory and national results. This can help build understanding of the results in the broader context of changes shaping early childhood development in Australia.

### When and how you will receive or access the report

Immediately available to schools upon completion of the AEDC, downloadable from the AEDC data collection system.

## AEDC School Profile Addendum\*



The School Profile Addendum includes everything in the School Profile plus trends in state/territory and national AEDC results, presented alongside your school's AEDC results.

March 2025, with the release of the national AEDC results. Provided securely to your school Principal via email and/or school administration portals. Contact your AEDC State and Territory Coordinator for more information.



### **AEDC Community Profile\*\***



Community Profiles present results from geographic areas, usually equivalent to a local government area. They include important information, such as demographics and characteristics of children in the area, to help provide context for the results. A Community Profile includes similar information to a School Profile and School Profile Addendum, but for children living in a community, regardless of where they attend school.

### **AEDC National Report**



The National Report provides a snapshot of the AEDC results across Australia including a breakdown by state/territory and key equity groups. Results from the current AEDC cycle are compared with all previous collection cycles, identifying trends in early childhood development across Australia. It highlights where gains have been made over time, and where more work is still needed.
